Weekly DuPage County COVID-19 Metrics for Schools

This week DuPage County remains at the substantial level of transmission. Our daily case count and our positivity rate both continue to climb at an alarming rate. **Important Note: The metrics are always for the week prior to posting.** We will continue to monitor closely, and we will continue to speak with the DuPage County Health Department weekly. Daily case counts in DuPage County are consistently ranging from 600-800. Additionally, deaths in DuPage County have increased as have hospitalizations. For comparison purposes, daily case counts were between 50 and 100 for the first several weeks of school.

We will be closely monitoring the data in the two weeks after Thanksgiving to determine whether we can move forward with our planned return to in-person instruction on January 4.
