

Please see the attached letter from Mrs. Lynn, Assistant Superintendent of Learning and Teaching, on our district technology practices related to safety and security.



Last spring we surveyed families about their experiences during our remote learning time. Many parents identified executive functioning as an area of difficulty for their child. Executive functioning is the thought process that allow people to plan, organize, make decisions, pay attention, and regulate behavior. These important skills are necessary not only for success in school but also in the world beyond school.

This year, all students in grades 3-8 are receiving explicit instruction in the development of executive functioning skills. Our teachers are using a curriculum created by the Rush NeuroBehavioral Center. The curriculum includes skill development in the areas of time management, study strategies, and personal growth skills such as goal setting, decision making, and learning strengths. I encourage you to ask your child about individual goals they have set for themselves at school.
