Weekly DuPage County COVID-19 Metrics for Schools

This week DuPage County remains at the substantial level of transmission, though we are seeing substantial improvement. Out of the four metrics monitored weekly, three are at the minimal level while one remains at the substantial level, though continued improvement has been seen for several consecutive weeks. This is great news, though there is still improvement needed, and it is critical that we remain vigilant with wearing masks, maintaining social distancing, and quarantining/isolating when there has been exposure, symptoms, and/or positive cases. Important Note: The metrics are always for the week prior to posting.

Since returning to school in January, we have had five positive cases of COVID-19.

District 12 Strategic Plan

At its February monthly meeting, the Board of Education approved the district goals for 2021-2024. The goals are shown below. One of the goals demonstrates the board and administration's belief in the importance of reading. Research has shown that students who are not reading on grade level by the end of third grade struggle to make up that ground.

The most effective way to grow as a reader is to simply read more. The second graphic shows the impact of reading twenty minutes per day. This investment of time on a daily basis pays big dividends in terms of reading growth and achievement. Reading magazine articles, news stories, graphic novels all count. Building this time into your daily routine at home can be the most powerful step families can take to support student learning.
