

Dear D12 Families,

One of the certainties at this time of year is a great deal of communication from the district, buildings, and classroom levels. The District strives to send planned communication at the beginning of the week, knowing that our schools and classrooms typically communicate at the end of the week. The District 12 Update typically has information on several items each time. Something that is viewed as very important, such as the safety information sent yesterday, will often be sent as a stand alone item.

School Board Meetings

The District 12 Board of Education holds one regular meeting per month, August through June. The dates are posted on the District website, the date for the next meeting is included in the top section of this newsletter, and a link to board meeting agendas is also provided. Our meetings are typically held at the Roselle Village Hall, and they are also live streamed. Families will receive a link to the live stream approximately 15 minutes before the start of the meeting. Not available at that time? The link can always be used later to watch the meeting.

Board of Education Elections

School Board elections are held every two years in the spring. The length of a term of service as an elected school board member is four years.

April 1, 2025 is the spring election date for the next school board election. Roselle SD12 will have four four-year terms up for election. Additionally, there will be one two-year term up for election. This is due to a resignation last year by a school board member. A new board member was appointed; however, an election must be held during the next election cycle to fulfill the remainder of that term, which is two years.

New legislation was passed in Springfield that moves up the date when interested candidates may start circulating petitions and also when candidate materials are required to be filed with the DuPage County Clerk's office. Petitions may begin to be circulated on August 20, 2024, and paperwork must be filed with the County Clerk between Tuesday, November 12 and Monday, November 18.
